

Meeting Notes

Introductions & Information Sharing (see list of attendees on last page):

- **Barbara Farnsworth** mentioned the Community Health Needs Assessment survey and training available for childcare providers on trauma-informed practices.
- **Maggie Cassel-Monroe** announced that the recovery center in Claremont is not closed, but that folks should talk to her about how to find it. A permanent solution is being developed.
- **Marjorie Matthews** wants to thank the providers who are referring families to their support group. Meetings are averaging 30 people, many new arrivals in crisis.
- **Martha Tecca** recommended Tri-State Learning Collaborative on Aging webinar on oral health.
- **Bill Boyle** mentioned that DH is sponsoring a Bridges Out of Poverty training on April 2nd.
- **Jeana Newburn** -- the LSRVNA Community Health Needs Assessment report is on their website.
- **Stacey Chiochio** announced that Hypertherm has joined the Governor's Recovery Supportive Workplace initiative and recently completed several days of supervisor training. Also, their volunteer fair is on May 3rd.
- **Jane Bennett** of the Health HUB says they are still looking for a mental health clinician.
- **Susan Wnuk** will send along the new CFSP eligibility guidelines.
- **Michele Morrell** introduced HACTC students who each shared their poverty project goals.
- **Laurie Harding** announced that Headrest has moved its outpatient program to space at APD, allowing them to expand beds at their transitional housing program by 4. They plan to begin some integrated services with APD, like MAT, in April.
- **Dana Michalovic** announced that Red Logan Dental Clinic has added to days a week of dental hygiene services.

Director's Update:

Alice provided brief update on 1) Vermont Outreach Project; 2) Dartmouth Social Impact Practicum projects on heat impacts of climate change and marketing PHC; and 3) release of 2017 Summer Meals Evaluation.

PHC Work Sessions:

Moms in Recovery Program, Dartmouth Hitchcock Addiction Treatment Program

- Katrin Tchana and Linda Snow shared information on their program, which formerly known as the Perinatal Addiction Treatment Program
- Started in 2013 with 6 pregnant women with opioid use disorder. Demand was very high as finding MAT at the time was very difficult. By 2015, they were serving 30 women. Now they are consistently serving between 30 and 40.
- Program offers prenatal and postnatal care, pediatrics, counseling, and case management in one location.
- Women are maintained in the program as long as they need to be there. A couple of women from the initial cohort are still involved, but most rotate out when they stabilize.
- A recent grant from the IDN allowing them to open intensive outpatient program, requiring 9 hours/week of treatment. Program includes support for children.
- They provide a mom-friendly, trauma-sensitive program.

Working Group Development:

- Healthy Eating and Active Living (Alice Ely)
 - Alice and Barbara provided update of 2018 summer meal plans.
 - Led to a brief discussion of the WIC program.

- Oral Health (Alice Ely)
 - UVSFL program records transferred to OHF, which will now serve these participants.
 - MCHC voted to host OHF Smiles in their clinic once a month.
 - Exploration of opportunities to work on oral health care for people in recovery.
- Aging in Community (Alice Ely)
 - Aging in Community Quarterly Forum on March 28. All are welcome to attend for presentation on financial abuse and fraud.
- All Together (Angie Leduc)
 - Shared a summary of the discussion from January 19th meeting.
- RCC for Emergency Preparedness (Steve Yannuzzi)
 - Steve is working on updating Emergency Response Plans;
 - Upper Valley, Greater Sullivan County, and Monadnock Regions are all talking with DH about how to have access to POD (point-of-dispensing) supplies for emergencies without purchasing supplies that will expire prior to use.
 - Stop the Bleed training last night had 19 participants.
