- Offer affirmation





## **Steering Committees**

- ▶ Includes 3-7 people from the community or the church the nurse serve
  - Includes retired and practicing nurses, nurse practitioners, and doctors and townspeople
- > Provide accountability
  - Meetings with the nurse on a quarterly basis
- > Relay information to potential donors and the community
  - Enhance funding for their nursing project
- Goal of this capstone: discover steering committee members' perception of community nurses

- ≻ Integrity
  - See life as successful
- ≻ Despair
  - See life as unproductive
  - Feelings of guilt about past
  - Life goals were not accomplished
- > Success in this stage leads to wisdom
  - Completeness and acceptance of death without fear

## Health System Issue: Aging in Community

- > The vast majority of older adults prefer to age in their own homes
- ➤ More comfort and less expense
- > Most would prefer to not spend their last days in the hospital
- Difficulty managing
  - Impaired mobility
  - Frailty
  - Risk for falls
  - Polypharmacy
- > Avoid hospitalizations and poor health outcomes

## Measuring Effectiveness of the Community/Parish Nurse

- Nurses are funded mainly through grants and donations from towns, community members, and non-profit organizations
- > Prior to August 2017, the nurses had no formal documentation system
  - No way of demonstrating the effectiveness or need for the community nurse
- "Evaluation" piece of the nursing process

## **Electronic Documentation Tool (EDT)**

- UVCNP began to utilize an electronic documentation tool in August 2017
- Used to gather clinical information to assist the nurse in developing a plan of care for her clients
- ➤ Increased funding
  - Increase resources
  - Improved care for a larger percentage of CDOAs

## **Assessment Summary**

- ➤ Population is aging
- ➤ More people wish to age in community
- Community and parish nurses support CDOAs
- Steering committees provide accountability and initiate fundraising to support the nursing projects
- Current need to evaluate the effectiveness of community nurses
- > Recent implementation of the EDT will begin to address this need

# Diagnosis

## **Health Diagnosis**

- Readiness for enhanced understanding of the effectiveness of UVCNP nurses in improving client's health outcomes among community members
  - Related to:
    - The lack of a formal, standardized documentation tool before August 2017
    - The recent initiation of the EDT
    - The lack of statistical evidence about the aggregate health outcomes
  - As evidenced by:
    - Stated need of data to present to the communities
    - Current lack of funding for the community and parish nurses
    - Gap in the literature

## **Top Health Problems and Interventions**

#### ➤ Health Problems:

- Fatigue/weakness
- Frequent falls
- Chronic Pain

#### Health Interventions:

- Medication
  - education/management
- Symptom management
- Addressing falls and safety issues

## **Community Educational Session**

- Total of 23 community members present, including a representative from each community
  - In attendance:
    - Community and parish nurses
    - Leaders of the UVCNP
    - Steering committee members
    - Community volunteers
    - A newspaper reporter
    - Executive Director of the Upper Valley Public Health Network

> The first time each community has come together as a whole

## **Community Educational Session**

- Initiated an engaging hourlong discussion with those present
- Discussion included:
  - Questions about the data presented
  - Future goals of EDT
  - Student's experience
     with the project

## **Moving Forward**

- The EDT will be a helpful tool for the UVCNP to use in order to demonstrate the effectiveness of the community and parish nurses
- This information will be important for the UVCNP and steering committee members to share with potential funders and the communities who hire town nurses

## Strengths

- Receptive and supportive key informants
- Group members' positive attitude
- Home visits with community/parish nurses
- Positive feedback from those present at the community educational session

## Limitations

- Limited experience with using
   Excel to formulate visual
   representations of the data
- Time constraints due to varying schedules
- Conceptual nature of this capstone project

## Recommendations

#### **Partnering Agency**

Continue to document through EDT and present data to steering committees and community members on a regular basis

#### **Future Capstones**

Continue collaboration with the UVCNP and create a survey to measure the effectiveness of educational sessions in increasing awareness of the community nurse

#### **CSC Nursing Program**

Incorporate a community home visit experience into the clinical curriculum



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
