Community Health Needs Assessment - Barbara Farnsworth

Hospitals required to do CHNA every 3 years. Data collected and used to write community health improvement plan (CHIP) to demonstrate how we will respond to what we learned from the community. NLH and Lake Sunapee VNA completed theirs, VRH conducting now. Just starting to distribute the CHNA for DHMC service area. Consumer survey will be open through August. Then, after report is received, will conduct community conversations early next year to review results. PHC to forward survey link as soon as it is available.

JC Penny and all fixed sites now taking walk-ins for vaccination between 3-6pm during the days when open.


Plans for health care providers to administer vaccine directly?

VT - Plans for middle of June, being accelerated and some have already begun to vaccinate on site in health clinics

NH - fixed sites planning to complete first doses by end of May, and finishing second doses by end of June, then will close. Then residents will need to get vaccines from pharmacies

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Up to date counts of vaccine provided by UV and GSC Public Health Networks (NH). Does not include vaccines provided through State-run Fixed Sites or Vermont vaccine distribution.
