Welcome

VT Equal Access to Broadband (Andra Daunhauer)

(Flyer and additional description in email)

VT households, Affordable connectivity program – households must qualify.

Internet service providers claim the voucher # and then pass along the discount to the household (\$30 off, some can be free but lower quality service). Help with application and process afterward. Offer an additional \$20 off for EC Fiber customers.

No similar navigator program in NH, but the benefit is available to NH residents. Martha Tecca offered to help people figure out how to navigate the NH system.

Upper Valley Community Health Improvement Plan (Alice Ely)

- Almost complete but needs review and input by partners
- Summary of community health improvement efforts planned across the Upper Valley
- Next step to reach out for review of the final stage review strategies and lead partners on strategies

Upper Valley Community Health Equity Partnership (Alice Ely)

- Two rounds of applications, awarded grants to 10 organizations in Upper Valley
- Springfield catchment area also funded around 10 applications

LGBTQ & Trauma (Hanna Brooks)

- Hanna shared a presentation discussing the trauma that LGBTQIA+ youth experience when they are
 raised in environments that aren't affirming of their gender identities or sexualities, and how to
 support these youth who are struggling with their mental health.
- She also discussed an Authenticity Activity to better connect with individuals who find it challenging to understand the importance of creating a safe and trusting space for the LGBTQIA+ community.

Music & Older Adults Project (Carol Langstaff)

- Community Nursing Programs are looking to support isolated residents
- Carol is involved with community nursing programs in Sharon and Strafford (VT) and wanted to use music as a way to reduce isolation
- She received a grant from Council on Aging and provide CDs, a player, and headphones to older adults. The CDs are made to match the person's music tastes.

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- Have seen evidence of the project improving mood by activating memories of joyful times

Healthcare Campaign Coordinator, Rights & Democracy NH (Heather Stockwell)

- Conducting a survey of people on Medicaid (or people who have applied) about their coverage and experience (deadline early February). Need to fill out interest form first to get the code to take state-related survey. Eligible for \$25 incentive payment.

- Work on advocacy around healthcare rights
- Medicare "unwinding" concerning because 6 million people (5 million children) could lose coverage
- Start process on April 1st, then will have 14 months to finish (June 2024)
- Rolling out new Medicaid dental program

Anna Hullinger - COVID-19 Test kits in NH can be ordered from the NH State Warehouse for free (non-profit, and for profit are allowed). Delivery may be possible but the state is still working on logistics.
