Panel: On the Priority of Cost of Health Care Services, Health Insurance, and Dental Care

Addressing Access and Cost of Health and Dental Care

- Sally Kraft, Dartmouth Health, Population Health
 - Access = affordable, available, accessible, accommodating, acceptable
 - Our use of health care services is not that much different than other countries, but our prices are much higher
 - o Dartmouth Health provides large amounts of subsidized and uncompensated care
 - o Age of existing primary care workforce is high so we are losing more and more PCP's
 - DH built new patient tower to increase capacity/beds to treat patients that need tertiary care
 - Invest in bringing services into the community by creating partnerships
 - Asking more social determinants of health screener questions to address whole person needs

 - o Becoming a FQHC by joining with Health First, an established FQHC based in Franklin
 - o Re-opening dental clinic Sept 1
 - Opening MAT by end of the year
 - Starting behavioral health and pharmacy by end of the year
- Liz Swanton, Alice Peck Day Memorial Hospital & Upper Valley Smiles Program (Presentation Slides available)
 - Brings dental care into the schools, no charge to families
 - Sees kids without regular dental care 47% had a cavity

Community-Based Supports and Navigation

- Kristin Barnum, Community Nurse Connection
 - Advocating for and supporting community nurse programs in communities across the region. For more details and to locate current community nurse programs: <u>Community</u> <u>Nurse Connection</u>
 - o Encourages people to advocate for community nurse programs in more towns.
- Lynne Goodwin, Lebanon Human Services
 - Helping residents with complex needs. Supporting residents to connect to services and it's challenging to find the resources.
 - Credits Community Nurse & Mobile Integrated Health Program with adding important resources.
- Mark Boutwell, Senior Solutions
 - Serves southern VT
 - o Care coordination, long term care case management
 - Working with hospital discharge teams to bridge care
 - Wants to be a resource for more organizations and partners. Contact him with questions and ideas.
