- 2022 Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA)
 - Completed every 3 years
 - In the UV, conducted by DH, APD, MAHHC, VNH, Gifford service areas using similar approaches and tool so information can be aggregated
 - Community members voice priority health concerns; supplemented by data
- 2023-2025 Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)
 - Completed every 3 years
 - Road map of what partners are doing, what is planned, how to participate, what gaps to fill
- 2025 Community Health Needs Assessment
 - Have priorities changed? Will strategies change?



Collective Impact is a **network** for community members, organizations and institutions that **advance equity** by learning together, aligning, and integrating their actions to **achieve population and systems-level change**.
